

# Sample Grounds for Bail Application in Criminal Offenses

The following are sample grounds that may be cited in a bail application for criminal offenses:

- The accused is not a flight risk and has a fixed residence within the jurisdiction of the court.
- The offense charged is bailable as a matter of right or discretion under the law.
- The accused undertakes to abide by all the conditions that may be imposed by the court for his/her temporary liberty.
- There is no strong evidence of guilt against the accused at this stage of the proceedings.
- The accused is suffering from a medical condition that warrants temporary release for proper treatment.
- The accused is willing and able to post the required bail bond to guarantee his/her appearance in court.
- The accused is gainfully employed (or a responsible student/businessperson) and interruption of his/her activities would cause undue hardship.
- The accused has dependents or family members who rely on him/her for support.
- Detention is causing or may cause grave prejudice to the accused's health, employment, or education.
- The prosecution has already completed the presentation of its evidence, and the accused has regularly appeared at all scheduled hearings.
- The accused has no previous criminal record or pending criminal case.
