

Sample IEP Goals and Objectives for Special Education

Academic Goal

Goal	Objectives
<p>Reading Comprehension By the end of the IEP period, the student will improve reading comprehension skills by accurately answering <u>80%</u> of questions related to grade-level texts.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">After reading a passage, the student will identify the main idea in <u>4 out of 5</u> trials.The student will recall three supporting details from a given text in <u>4 out of 5</u> opportunities.The student will use context clues to define unfamiliar words with <u>80%</u> accuracy.

Social/Emotional Goal

Goal	Objectives
<p>Self-Regulation The student will demonstrate self-regulation strategies to manage frustration in the classroom in <u>4 out of 5</u> observed opportunities.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">When feeling frustrated, the student will use a learned coping strategy (deep breathing, counting, etc.) before reacting in <u>80%</u> of incidents.The student will verbally express feelings or request a break when overwhelmed in <u>3 out of 5</u> occurrences.With teacher support, the student will rejoin classroom activities after a break in <u>4 out of 5</u> opportunities.

Communication Goal

Goal	Objectives

Expressive Language

The student will use age-appropriate vocabulary to express wants and needs during classroom activities, meeting this goal in 80% of opportunities.

- The student will make a complete request using a sentence starter ("I need...", "Can I have...") in 4 out of 5 opportunities.
- The student will correctly answer simple "who," "what," "where" questions about classroom routines in 80% of attempts.
- The student will participate in structured turn-taking conversations with peers in 3 out of 5 weekly opportunities.

Functional/Independence Goal

Goal	Objectives
Daily Living Skills The student will independently follow a two-step classroom routine (e.g., unpack backpack, hand in homework) in <u>90%</u> of opportunities.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The student will transition to the classroom and unpack personal items without reminders in <u>4 out of 5</u> days.• The student will check a visual schedule to identify next steps in <u>80%</u> of weekly routines.• With minimal prompts, the student will independently clean up materials after activities in <u>4 out of 5</u> sessions.
